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generation ago, ECMO meetings attracted intensivists and other doctors who were interested in seeing what ECMO was about and whether they should consider establishing a centre in their hospital.

In recent years, ECMO has become the first line circulatory support for patients with refractory cardiogenic shock in many centres worldwide. Encouraging results have also been seen for patients who received ECMO because of severe respiratory failure or as a bridge to lung transplantation.

We are pleased to announce important collaborations with the Société de Réanimation de Langue Française (SRLF) and the International Consortium for Research in ECMO (ECMONet). The results of these initiatives will be discussed in joint sessions at the heart of the International Congress on ECMO program. In addition, a young investigator prize will be awarded to the best poster, with an invitation for its author to attend the next SRLF congress in January 2016.

This year's meeting will also include a pre-congress practical course, held at La Pitié Salpêtrière's Institut de Cardiologie, 24 June.
